

The Significance of Katina Robe Offering

The month of October is important to Buddhists all over the world as it is the time for annual Katina Robe Offering Ceremony in temples. It is a practice since Buddha's days for the Buddhist Monks to observe a three-month seclusion period starting from the month of July, and conduct special Dhamma programs including meditation retreats in Buddhist temples. The culmination of this special period is all lay devotees getting together and offering monastics gifts such as robes and alms. This year in Brisbane, the Katina ceremonies in Forest Lake and Goodna temples have been scheduled to be held on the last week of October and first week of November, respectively.



The tradition and the manner of holding these events has evolved gradually over the years. But it is the practice in most temples for a group of lay people to get together to form a team (Katina Group) and

sponsor special religious functions such as Dhamma Talks, Pujas in consultation with the venerable monks of the temple. In addition to the spiritual practices, the Katina Group also prepares and carries out special tasks in the temple such as cleaning the premises, and upgrading and maintaining the existing buildings. Most members of Katina Group take part themselves in these events and encourage their friends and relatives to join them. At the end of the 3-month period, a Pirith Ceremony at night, followed by a Dana Ceremony (alms giving) next day, is organised. Specially prepared Katina Robe is offered before the commencement of the alms-giving function. For these ceremonies, usually all the monks and nuns in neighbouring temples are invited and most lay people make it a point to participate at least in these final ceremonies annually and share merits. Lay people offer robes, alms and all other needs for the regular maintenance of the temple.

In Buddhist texts it is stated that the Katina robe offering is one of the highest offerings and the most meritorious of skilful deeds. Furthermore, because of these annual ceremonies, the close symbiotic relationship between the monastics and the laity is further cemented. The continuation of the Buddha Sasana very much depends upon the upholding of the Buddha's teachings (Dhamma) and discipline (Vinaya) by both the monastic and the lay communities.

The Annual Katina Ceremony is undoubtedly helping to achieve these supreme goals.

Celebrating Older Persons and Grandparents

The month of October marks two days to celebrate the senior citizens. The United Nations International Day for Older Persons (UNIDOP) falls on 1 October while the last Sunday of each year is the Australian Grandparents Day (AGD).

Globally, there were 703 million persons aged 65 or over in 2019. Over the next three decades, the number of older persons worldwide is projected to more than double, reaching more than 1.5 billion persons in 2050. All regions will see an increase in the size of the older population between 2019 and 2050.

This year (2020) marks the 30th anniversary of the UNIDOP. Considering the far higher risks faced by the older persons amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, the policies are to be targeted to raising awareness of their special needs.

each year. It is a day to recognise the special role played by the grandparents and their contribution they make to their families and communities.



පදයක වරුණ: මෝහිනීගේ බැල්ම

රාතුී කාලයේදී මහමගදී දකින්නට ලැබෙනවා යැයි පැවසෙන මෝහිනීගේ අවතාරය ලාංකේය සමාජයේ වඩාත් පුවලිත වූවකි. සිංහල ජනශුතිය තුළ දීර්ඝ කාලයක සිට පැවතෙන මෝහිනී පිළිබද කතාපුවත්වලට සවත් දීමට ඇතැමෙක් පියතාවක් දක්වති. ඇතැමෙක් එමගින් බියට පත්වෙති. කෙසේ වුවද මෝහිනී පිළිබද සංකල්පයේ පුහවය හා භාවිතය සම්බන්ධයෙන් ජනතාව තුළ පවතිනුයේ අල්පාවබෝධයකි.

මෝහිනී යනු 'මෝහන' යන පදයේ ස්තුී ලිංගාර්ථයයි. 'මෝහන' යන පදයෙන් අර්ථවත් වනුයේ සිත් වසගවීම, මුලා වීම හෝ එක් පුද්ගලයෙකු විසින් තවත් පුද්ගලයෙකුගේ මනස කිසියම් මෙහෙයවීමකට ලක් කිරීමකි. එය මනෝවිදාාත්මක කරුණක් වන අතර 'මෝහිනී' යන යෙදුම 'ආකර්ෂණය ලබන්නී' වැනි අරුතකින් යෙදෙන්නකි. නූතනයේ පවා දකුණු ඉන්දීය ජන සමාජයේ මෙය පුද්ගල නාමයක් ලෙස භාවිත කෙරේ.

ලාංකේය සමාජයේ අපට අසන්නට ලැබෙන මෝහිනී සුදු සාරියකින් සැරසී දරුවෙකු වඩාගෙන සිටින ස්තුියකි. ඇය දර්ශනය වනවා යැයි පැවසෙන්නේ රාතුී කාලයේ මහමග තනිව ගමන් ගන්නා පුරුෂයින්ට පමණි. මෙහි සමාජවිදාාත්මක හා මනෝවිදාාත්මක භාවිතය අවබෝධ කර ගැනීම සදහා මෝහිනී පිළිබද උත්පත්ති කතාව ද පුයෝජනවත් වේ.

දකුණු ඉන්දීය ජනශුැතියකට අනුව අතීතයේ එක් තරුණ ස්තියක් පුරුෂයින් අතින් සමූහ දූෂණයකට ලක්ව සාතනය වී තිබේ. පසුව ඇයගේ සිරුර පාළු වන පෙදෙසක රහසිගතව වළ දමා ඇත. බොහෝ කලකට පසුව එම පුදේශයේ වගා කටයුත්තක් ආරම්භ කළ තරුණයෙක් බිම් සැකසීම් සිදු කරද්දී පොළොවෙන් මතුපිටට රතු රුධිරය පැමිණ තිබේ. පසුව එම රුධිරය සිරුරක් බවට පත් වී දරුවෙකු ද අතින් ගෙන තරුණයාට තමන්ව භාර ගත්තා ලෙස පවසා තිබේ. ඇතැම් කතාවකට අනුව ඇය එම තරුණයාව සාතනය කර තිබේ. මෙය ඉන්දියානු සාතිතාය පිළිබදව මා විසින් සිදු කෙරුණ පශ්චාද් උපාධි අධායනයේදී එක් රැස් කළ දත්ත අතර පැවති ජනශුැතියකි. මේ පිළිබද තවත් වෙනස් කතා පුවත් පැවතිය හැකිය.

මෙම ජනශුැතිය තරුණයින්ගේ සමාජ වර්යාව සහ මනෝහාවයන් සමග සෘජු හා වනු සම්බන්ධතාවක් පෙන්නුම් කරයි. තාරුණායට එළඹීමත් සමග විරුද්ධ ලිංගිකයින් කෙරෙහි ආකර්ෂණයක් ඇති වන තරුණ තරුණියන් එකිනෙකා අතර ඇති කරගන්නා සබදතාවන්හි අවසානය කායික සබදතාවක් දක්වා ගමන් කරයි. එහිදී තමන් අයත් වන සමාජ සාංස්කෘතික වටාපිටාව අනුව පුද්ගල හැසිරීම් පාලනය නොවුව හොත් තරුණියන්ට අනවශා ගැබ ගැනීම් හා දරු උපත්වලට මුහුණ දීමට සිදු වේ. අනෙක් අතට තරුණයින් විසින් තරුණියන් කෙරෙහි සිය බලය යොදවා සමාජ විරෝධී කිුයාවලට යොමු වීමට ඉඩ තිබේ.

මෝහිනී දර්ශනය වීම තරුණ සිතේ ජනිත වන මනෝහාවයක් විය හැකිය. එමගින් වීරුද්ධ ලිංගිකයින් කෙරෙහි ආකර්ෂණය වීමට මනස සූදානම බව සංකේතවත් වේ. මෝහිනීගේ අවතාරය දුටු තරුණයින්ට වහාම විවාහයක් කර දෙන ලෙසට පැරණි ජන සමාජයේ මතයක් නිර්මාණය වූයේ මෙම සමාජ හා මනෝවිදාහත්මක පදනම පිළිබද පැරැන්නන් තුළ පැවති අවබෝධය නිසා විය යුතුය.

Teaching Mother Languages

The United Nations organisation has declared the 21st of February as the International Mother Language Day to inspire over 6000 Mother Languages used by half of the world population.

Since February 2000, UNESCO and other international organizations have celebrated the International Mother Language Day with a multitude of programs related to culture and language to promote family values within the native speakers.



In Sri Lanka, Sinhala and Tamil are the two mother languages. Over 17 million people use Sinhala as the first language and nearly 2 million people use Sinhala as a second language. In addition, members of Sri Lankan diaspora, mainly in Australia, UK, Italy, USA, Canada and the Middle East, also use Sinhala as a second language.

Tamil, the second main language of Sri Lanka, is used by approximately 2.5 million people, especially in the North, East and the Central part of the country. Tamil native speakers are around 65 - 70 million worldwide, predominantly in USA, India, Singapore, Malaysia, Fiji, Mauritius, Canada, UK, Norway, and Australia.

Hence, members of the Sri Lankan diaspora worldwide have to inspire their second and third generations to use their mother tongue to communicate within the members of their families, relatives in the motherland as well as members of the diaspora living nearby and in other countries. Australia is significant as the biggest Sinhala speaking community outside Sri Lanka. Australia is a country that has given great importance to multiculturalism and the use of mother tongue because Australia believes that society is enriched by multiculturalism. Therefore, governments at all levels have allocated funds and resources to improve those cultural heritages among ethnic groups.

Basically, people living outside their motherland have to pay attention to improve both Sinhala and Tamil languages as second languages because the third generation of children is pursuing studies in English language in Australia. Thus, teachers must practice second language skills when they attempt to teach the third and fourth generations of both Sinhala and Tamil origin children.

The second language skills mean teachers have to improve children's listening qualities because listening is a key proficiency which is used to get more information through communication; secondly, they have to improve speaking skills, thirdly the reading skills and finally they should improve the writing skills for students.


Still, it is observed that in many Sinhala and Tamil language schools in Australia as well as other countries, the lessons are mainly delivered in Sri Lankan style as first language education practice. This is a challenge for the third/fourth generations who undertake 80-90% of their education in English language. It appears hard to absorb the language required for informal communication in an interesting way. Many parents, as well as teachers, use various methods to communicate their mother tongue. Unfortunately, the younger generation prefers to reply in English due to the teaching methods used without the basic understanding of the second language abilities.


Use of modern second language teaching and learning techniques and online tools and resources such as video lessons, news items, small stories, cartoons and paper articles to improve listening, reading, speaking and writing skills, by both parents and teachers will improve language skills in their students and children.



Former Cricketer Tony Opatha Passes Away

A former Sri Lankan One Day International (ODI) cricketer Tony Opatha passed away on 11 September.

He was born on August 5, 1947, in Colombo. The right-arm medium pace bowler played five ODIs at the 1975 and 1979 Cricket World Cups.

Educated at St. Peter's College, Colombo, Tony later joined the Royal Ceylon Volunteer Air Force in 1968. He had played for his college cricket team and went on to play for the air force cricket team till 1977.

He first played for Ceylon in 1971 and was a member of the Sri Lankan teams playing in the

World Cups in England in 1975 and 1979. He later played club cricket in Ireland for one season in 1979 and was offered the coach position of the Holland team.

As player/manager of the rebel tour to South Africa in 1982-83, in defiance of the sporting ban against the apartheid state, he and the other tourists received a lifetime ban from international cricket.

In September 2018, he was one of 49 former Sri Lankan cricketers felicitated by Sri Lanka Cricket, to honour them for their services before Sri Lanka became a full member of the International Cricket Council (ICC).



Into the Water is the second thriller fiction novel written by critically acclaimed author Paula Hawkins. Stories Behind Names of Places in Sri Lanka: How Marassana got its Name


More than fifty percent of the names I have discussed in the "Dæhæna" are linked to incidents of the Kings of our country. How the Kandyan village "Marassana" got its name too is linked to a King, King Rajasinghe.

After the Western powers captured the coastal areas of Sri Lanka the provincial Kings of the nation were disturbed. They expected an invasion into their territory at any moment. Kandy, the last Kingdom runover by the British, was the most disturbed.

The King lived in fear and it is said that King Sri Wickrama Rajasinghe spent sleeping in at least three different bedrooms in one night. He vacated the palace and sought shelter in other places. Hanguranketha was another place he chose to hide.

When the British received the information that King Rajasinghe dis-

guised as an ordinary man was on his way walking to Hanguranketha, soldiers were sent to capture him. The King too sensed that the white soldiers were following him. He wanted to take shelter and walked to a house and requested for food. The woman in the house felt that this cannot be an ordinary man. She felt that he was a different person but never thought he was the King and offered respectable seating and food respectfully. Her husband did not like her being so respectful to a stranger. Nudge: How Behavioural Economics Can Shape Your Decisions

In 2008, two professors at the University of Chicago, Richard H. Thaler and Cass R. Sunstein, published Nudge: Improving Decisions about Health, Wealth, and Happiness. It is considered as one of the most significant books on public policy published in recent years. The authors argue that governments should help their citizens to make better decisions while respecting their freedom of choice. This article highlights the applicability of their ideas to policy by providing a few examples of nudges in areas such as finance, health, and the environment.



Nudge theory is based on the idea that the way how choices are presented to the consumers can steer people toward decisions that, in turn, beneficial to them/society at the end. For instance, the cafeteria that promotes healthy eating by putting

fruits first and desserts last. Other examples might be a firm that automatically enrols its employees into a superannuation program while allowing them to opt-out, or providing information on the households use of energy relative to the 100 nearest houses of similar size. These examples all encourage certain behaviours without banning any options or forcing any particular choice.

Few more practical examples:

Smaller plates = less food waste

The Danish Executive Summit is a prestigious annual event for the Danish CEOs. It reduced food waste by 26 percent by only replacing larger plates (27 cm) with smaller (24 cm) at a lunch serving 500 CEOs.

Bleep — Honk Reduction System

This nudge is intended to minimize indiscriminate honking on Indian roads. A red smiley button starts beeping and blinking every time the driver honks. The driver must press the button to turn it off. Drivers decreased their honking over six months by an average of 61 per cent because the red buzzer was such a nuisance. Apparently, most of the honking was (more or less) habitual and unrelated to safety.

We must also be aware as consumers that we can be nudged on different occasions in our day-to-day business interactions. For example, **The Decoy Effect:**

The decoy effect describes how the inclusion of a third, less desirable option (the decoy), will affect our preference of the original two options when we select between two options.


e.g. Imagine lining up to buy some popcorn in a movie theatre. You see the small box costs \$3; medium is \$6.50, and the large is \$7. You really do not need a whole large popcorn, but you end up buying it anyway because it is a much better deal than the medium. In this case, the medium size is the 'Decoy', and they do not expect you to by medium size.

In summary, nudge theory provides a wonderful approach to define, evaluate, and re-form current choices and factors offered to citizens by governments, companies, and other authorities in shaping their choices.


