International Literacy Day 2022

This year's International Literacy Day will be celebrated worldwide on Thursday, 8th of September, under the theme Transforming Literacy Learning Spaces, with the intention of bringing the ownership of the challenges of literacy back home to the local community.



So why has the UNESCO devoted a specific day to recognize literacy since 1967? Traditionally, literacy has meant the ability to read and write. Miriam Webster Dictionary defines it as the 'quality or state of being literate; educated...able to read and write". But these days, this meaning has been expanded to include the knowledge and skills people need to listen to, read, view, speak, write and create oral, print, visual and digital texts for different purposes in a range of contexts. It now includes the skills and abilities to access, understand, analyse, evaluate information, make meaning, express thoughts and emotions, present ideas and opinions, interact with others and participate effectively in the world around them.

In the 21st century, literacy is a fundamental human right. Yet, according to the UNESCO there are 781 million illiterate adults (over the age of 15) around the world. Over 63% of these adults, are women. There is increasing research evidence to show that literacy learning should not stop at school but should continue throughout a person's life enabling life-long learning and better social and economic outcomes. Literacy is a vital tool for breaking the cycle of poverty and for delivering improved outcomes in health, employment, economy, gender equality, self- esteem and overall quality of life. It is a vital tool for effective participation in democracy and promotion of peace. This year's theme of transforming literacy learning spaces aims to raise the awareness of community learning spaces that are needed to encourage life- long learning in all members of our local community.

According to OECD, 40-50% of adults in Australia have literacy skills below the international standard required for participation in work, education and society. Having a low level of literacy is not the same as being illiterate which is the inability to read or write. A low level of literacy is more complex and relates to people's difficulties in reading, writing and understanding a range of information and texts that allows them to participate fully in society. In Australia, people from migrant and aboriginal communities, people with learning difficulties, people who have experienced frequent school changes or absences from school due to economic or social reasons are particularly vulnerable to having low literacy skills, thereby entrenching the cycle of poverty in particular sections of our community. The International Literacy Day aims to raise our awareness of gaps within our local community which we can all help to address.

Travis Sinniah Honoured by National Defense University

On August 9, the National Defense University in Washington DC welcomed three new CISA alumni to the International Fellows Hall of Fame in a ceremony held in Sydney, Australia during NDU's 16th Alumni Continuing Education Security Seminar, the statement issued by College of International Security Affairs of National Defense University (NDU).



During the event, Admiral (Ret) Travis Sinniah has been recognized for his service as Commander of the Sri Lankan Navy. He is the first Sri Lankan to be inducted.

Admiral Travis Sinniah, WWV, RWP, RSP, USP, ndu, psc was a Sri Lankan admiral and the 21st Commander of the Sri Lanka Navy. He has served as the Commander of Sri Lanka's Eastern

Naval Area and as Flag Officer Commanding the Naval Fleet. He was the second Tamil to be appointed the commander of the Sri Lankan Navy after Rajan Kadiragamar in the 1960s.

Admiral Sinniah was the senior-most naval officer to be in active combat operations at sea during the war. He was awarded the highest combat medal (granted to a living officer) for exceptional valour and gallantry, the Weera Wickrama Vibhushanaya (WWV), and recommended for field promotion to the rank of Rear Admiral on account of his exceptional contribution to the war effort.

BOOK REVIEW: A Life on Our Planet – My Witness Statement by David Attenborough

To anyone interested in nature and conservation, David Attenborough needs no introduction. Sir David Attenborough is Britain's, if not the world's, best known natural history documentary maker. Having joined BBC as a trainee producer in 1952, he rose to become the Controller of BBC2 during which time he introduced colour television to Britain and then to be the Director of Programmes for BBC Television. Then in 1973, he abandoned administration to be documentary making and writing. The rest is history.

A Life on Our Planet

His witness statement covers the period 1937 when he was 11 years old to 2020 when he was 94 when this book was written. During this period, the world population grew from 2.3 billion David to 7.8 billion and the remaining wilderness de-Attenborough clined from 66 per cent to 35 per cent.



The book explains the development of life on earth, slow and steady for the most part, interrupted by five mass extinctions. Each time the nature collapsed leaving only a few survivors to start the process again. The last time it happened

was 66 million years ago changing the course of natural history, wiping out three-quarters of all species including the 175-million-year reign of the dinosaurs. For 66 million years since then, nature has been at work reconstructing the living world, creating and refining a diversity of species. One of those species is humanity.

Since the retrieval of the glaciers, past 10,000 years or so known as Holocene has been one of the most stable periods of the planet. This stability led to the rhythm of the seasons and humans made use of these to start farming. Farming transformed the relationship between humans and nature.

Identifying the use of fossil fuels as the greatest challenge the author identifies vested interests as the most formidable challenge with six of the ten major companies in the world being oil and gas companies. The quest for perpetual growth and measurement of development using crude measures such as GDP leading to the rapid decline in the balance with nature

Right now, per UN's earth overshoot day, humans consume 1.7 times the amount of resources that the planet can produce. If this trend continues the planet will come to an irreversible tipping point.

In the section "Vision for the Future", the book discusses the measures for a sustainable economy as three "P"s – profit, people and planet. The hope is that a "sustainability revolution" will bring products and services that reduce the impact on the planet just the way, industrial revolution and digital revolution brought prosperity.

The book concludes that Anthropocene (the geological period in which the human activity has been the dominant influence on climate and the environment) which some say started in 1950s, could be a uniquely brief period, one that ends the human civilisation unless the human species come together to save the planet and indeed them-

The Afghans of Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka and Afghanistan share a deep history and connection through a little known ethnic group called the Ceylonese Afghans.

The Ceylonese Afghans trace their ancestry to the regions of modern day Afghanistan and Central Asia. The community is part of the larger Pashtun ethnic group making up a significant population in modern day Pakistan and Afghanistan. Also known as Pathans, the Ceylonese Afghans were recorded in Ceylon's first census in British Ceylon. Known as Kabul Manushiyan and Afghan Manushiyan in Ceylonese and Moor Tamil, Afghan Karayo in Sinhalese, Orang Bengali in Sri Lankan Malay indicates that their presence was known to all communities.

Ceylon Afghans arrived as horse breeders and keepers, labourers, elephant keepers, and mercenaries from as early at the 1st century. However, they continued to immigrate to Ceylon throughout its history.



As Sunni Muslims, Ceylonese Afghans have contributed to the erection of mosques including the iconic Red Mosque on Castle Hill Street in Colombo. A little known fact is that many of Sri Lanka's railroads were also constructed using Ceylonese Afghan labour. Transport across old Ceylon was a domain within which

they featured prominently as coachmen connecting various communities.

Afghans also played an important role in Australia with many significant communities being established through the skilful camel caravans of Afghan Cameleers. One such Cameleer and national Australian icon is Gool Mahomet, a fascinating character who worked in Central Australia and established the Adelaide Mosque. Gool Mahomet began his career as a cameleer in Ceylon before migrating to Australia in the late 18th century. Gool Mahomet's story is reflective of the modern story of many migrants. Our ancestors converged from around the world onto the paradisiacal islands of Ceylon, before lamentably leaving once more to seek security in another country.

Severely affected by post-independence nationalism, many Ceylonese Afghans were deported from Ceylon as they were deemed noncitizens despite living on the islands for centuries. The Citizenship and Repatriation Act deemed individuals unable to prove their father's birth in Ceylon or their status as third generation descendants to be ineligible for citizenship. At a time during which birth registration was uncommon, this led to the mass deportation of Afghans along with many other communities from Sri Lanka.

Ceylonese Afghans continue to contribute in the present. A prominent Ceylonese Afghan is Kareem Zameer, a medical and political historian and presenter of "Lost and Forgotten". Kareem has been significantly involved in documenting the history and diversity of ethnic groups in Sri Lanka and has authored several books on the subject including "Afghans of Sri Lanka, an Untold Story".

Let's end with a beautiful quote from Kareem Zameer himself: "Nevertheless, we haven't forgotten our roots; we still love our Kabuli Palao, kebabs, mantus, yoghurt, almonds, dried fruits, nuts, Bonjan, Masteh, etc. and our Pashto mores have survived to this day. Just like our Afghan brethren, we too believe in sainthood and Sufism. Despite the checkered history, I am very proud of my Afghan, Indian and Malay roots, but I am through and through Sri Lankan".

Stories Behind Names of Places in Sri Lanka: **NEBODA**

Neboda is a growing village in the Western Province between Horana and Kalutara.

The story behind this village is surprisingly not connected to a King or a ruler but to an incident linked to Ayurveda medicine.

People lived healthy lives and only the native medication system known as Ayurveda prevailed in the country. There lived a village chief closer to the area where we now call Neboda. He was suffering from gastritis and the native doctor, the vedamahaththaya, prescribed him to drink "Kithul piti kenda" every morning.



Kithul is a common palm tree in Sri Lanka and its flower is tapped to make toddy and treacle for making of sweets. The Kithul timber is extremely strong and lasts for generations. Making Kithul piti (Kithul flour) was a hard job and time consuming.

The Kithul tree has to be cut down and fallen tree is opened and split into two longitudinally. The flour is made from the soft centre material which is called the "Kithul Boda". This softer material is chopped, pounded, mixed with water and poured into cloth buckets and hung overnight to drain the water. What is left in the cloth buckets is dried in the sun for days. That powder is called "Kithul piti".

The villagers went to the jungle and selected the best tree visible and fell it. When they sprit the trunk of the tree it was a surprise. There was no "KITHUL BODA" and the middle was empty. Everyone said "නෑ බොඩ". So with this incident people called this village "NEBODA'.

Ten Ss to Keep the Doctor Away

Everything changes and as a result ageing is inevitable.

Yet, we can slow the ageing process significantly by avoiding things that accelerate ageing.

Here are 10 things to avoid in order to slow down ageing and live longer and healthier.

- 1. Sleeping late or sleeping less than 6 hrs at night. Sleeping more than 9 hours is also detrimental because of lack of physical activity, lethargy, inadequate nutrition and hydration, lack of vitamin D etc.
- 2. Sunshine- Sunshine is essential for health. The natural source of vitamin D is sunshine. But more than 15 to 20 minutes exposure to sun at one time can harm the skin and cause wrinkles and even skin cancer with very long exposure on a daily basis.
- 3. Standard American Diet (SAD)- a big portion, too much carbohydrates, processed food and fried food. Very little or no vegetables. This type of diet leads to weight gain, type 2 diabetes, high cholesterol, and other metabolic and hormonal imbalances. Reduced thyroid and sex hormones are such examples.
- 4. Sugar- Sugar is the culprit responsible for a number of chronic diseases such as obesity, heart disease, diabetes, metabolic disorders and some types of cancers. Starchy food such as white bread, white polished rice, pasta, noodles,pizza, cakes and sweets get converted to sugar and therefore understanding the food types is very important to avoid these diseases .
- 5. Smoking- It ages you faster and kills you slowly. Smoking damages the inner lining of airways and causes airway obstruction. It can also cause lung cancer. Narrowing of blood vessels is another smoking related disease and reduces blood supply to the heart leading to heart attack. Reduction of blood supply to legs limits physical activity due to pain.

- 6. Spirits and wine -all types of alcoholic drinks increase body weight, reduce cognitive functions, increase the chance of having gallstones and kidney stones They also cause liver disease. Safe dose of alcohol recommended by the National Institute of Clinical Excellence in the UK is zero. The Australian guidelines to reduce harm from alcohol issued by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) states that healthy men and women should drink no more than 10 standard drinks a week or 4 standard drinks on any one day. This is only for healthy adults and not for everyone. One standard drink is any type of alcohol that contains 10grams of pure alcohol. The less you drink the lower your risk of harm from alcohol.
- 7. Substance abuse- addiction to substances masks root causes of stress and they harm the organs in the body.
- 8. Sedentary lifestyle and sitting- more hours of sitting than standing and walking increases weight gain and reduces oxygenation to tissues
- 9. Stress- Imbalanced and disorganised life is chaotic and leads to stress. Stress management is about paying attention inwards to watch how we live life moment by moment objectively. This is the most valuable life skill one can master in order to live a stress free life.
- 10. Self centred or self orientation- when we think and do things only concerning ourselves, we have more worries, anxiety, depression than when we let go of self centred attitude and cultivate universal benevolence. This way of living fills us with joy without needing external things to make us happy and healthy and we can live a more fulfilled life with connections with others, nature and the planet we live in.
