

BOOK REVIEW: Horns by Joe Hill

Horns is a dark fantasy novel written by Joe Hill, the son of awardwinning author Stephen King. It is his second published work of fiction and explores the story of Ignatius Perrish, a young man who wakes up one morning with horns growing out of his head.



A year after his girlfriend Merrin dies in terrible circumstances, Ignatius develops horns and some terrifying powers to go with them. He uses his newfound abilities to try and find out what exactly happened on the night she died. It takes him on a crazy journey that forces him to reflect on his childhood, his beliefs, and his relationships with his family & friends. The story follows a non-linear timeline, meaning the narrative isn't told in chronological order. It allows key details of the plot to be revealed at a perfect pace and with ideal timing – it's obvious to see that the structure of the story has been well thought out. Even

though the main characters are written to be flawed, imperfect people, they still have a degree of relatability to them. Their motivations and feelings to the events of the story is well explained by each character's past, and values, which are either laid out or alluded to during the story. The novel encompasses several dark and sometimes morbid themes but overall, it delivers a message good vs evil – not in a "superhero crime-fighter" sense but more regarding the internal battle that individual humans go through all the time. The story especially highlights how one's upbringing and life experiences can influence your perception of this battle and what side you might ultimately embrace.


There are a few reasons why I consider this as one of my favourite books. Firstly, even though, overall, the story is a gothic piece of literature, it has sci-fi, romantic, and comedic elements included. I enjoyed how all these genres combined to deliver the story's message in a subtle way, but not so subtle that you end the story wondering what the point of the book was. Secondly, I found the story itself to be enjoyable. It isn't necessarily unique but the way the story was used to convey its themes elevated itself and made it more interesting. Lastly, Hill's writing style is simple and fast-paced, so the plot never lingers in one spot and each page is important in driving the story – whether it's recounting events from Ignatius' childhood or describing the effect of his new powers. Overall, I would recommend this book to anyone who is a fan of thriller and suspense and isn't put off by dark themes. Ultimately, the basic plot is a love story so fans of romance may also enjoy this book. However, readers should be over the age of 18 as there are mature themes including violence and gore. I hope anyone who reads this book will include it as one of their favourites like I did.

Multiculturalism in Sri Lanka: A summary

This article marks the first of a three part series on multiculturalism exploring what it is, why it matters and how to pave a path towards true acceptance. Here, we will explore some examples of Sri Lankan culture that have been touched and changed as a result of multiculturalism.

Sri Lanka's journey towards multiculturalism began many years before the arrival of European ships. It begins with over 50,000 years of tribal multiculturalism among Wanniyala-Aetto. Sri Lanka also featured prominently on ancient trading routes and was known to cultures around the world. These communities often used names such as Serendib (Arabian and Persian), Taprobana (Greek), Zeilan (Portuguese) and Lanka (Sanskrit) to refer to the island. Sri Lanka being a stop on global trade routes has led to a unique melting pot of ethnic mixing as these cultures settled our islands.

Multiculturalism is deeply embedded in many facets of Sri Lankan culture, traditions and society. Multiculturalism is why one can move through the Dutch Hulftsdorp to the English Kent Street, from Javan Ja Ela to the Scottish Elgin Falls, or from the Portuguese Galle to the Malay Hambanthota. It is also why one finds a mosque, church and temple within an ancient Portuguese Fort. The iconic 500 year old baobabs of Mannar planted by ancient Arab traders and thousand year old mosques are also a testament to this diversity. Multiculturalism is why individuals wearing Portuguese lace wear (blouses) play the Malay Rabane whilst singing folksongs in Sinhalese on Avurudu. It is how the Sinhalese language combined with the Portuguese violins, Afro rhythms and Malay drums to create Baila. Over 500 years of Afro Portuguese culture has now made Baila the unofficial Lankan wedding music and dance.

Multiculturalism is why it is normal to have English tea for breakfast, Indonesian nasi goreng, Dutch lamprais for lunch and Moorish biryani and Tamil hoppers for dinner.

Multiculturalism is why Malay and African soldiers supported the Kandyan armies. It is why independence was an accomplishment fought for by Irish, Afghan, Burgher, Moor, Bohora, Memon, Tamil, Parsi, Malay, Javan, Sinhalese, Wanniyala-Aetto and other communi-

Multiculturalism is why all ethnicities irrespective of their religious beliefs make the pilgrimage to Katharagama, a place where Hindu, Buddhist and 50,000 years of Indigenous religions blend. It is why an integral part of the Kandy Perahera is the

Wanniyala-Aetto gifting wild honey to the Dalada Maligawa.

Multiculturalism is why years of DNA research has challenged the notion of ethnic purity in Sri Lanka. Studies have shown our kinship in that individuals across the communities in Sri Lanka share genetic similarities with each other. Naturally, co-habitation, intermixing and marriage between various communities over millennia have created palpably mixed genetic, linguistic, cultural and religious traditions. Multiculturalism surrounds us on a daily basis and it has filtered into every nook and cranny of Sri Lankan society and culture, and understanding it will be beneficial to the entire nation. Please join us next month for an understanding of why embracing multiculturalism in Sri Lanka is vital.

Stories Behind Names of Places in Sri Lanka: HALAWATHA

"Halawatha" is a famous city in the North-Western province of Sri Lanka. This is one of the few cities that received a different name in English due to the pronouncing difficulties of the white rulers that invaded Sri Lanka. They called this city CHILAW, like calling the city "kanda" KANDY and Megamuwa" NEGAMBO. HALAWATHA the coastal city is well known for fishing. The birth of the name to this place is linked to the time the country was under the Sri

Lankan Kings. There had been a provincial ruler appointed by the King who happened to be born to a Muslim mistress of the King. Understandably, the Sinhala people did not like to be ruled by a leader with a different cultural background.



To overcome this situation astrologers were consulted and they advised to perform some pooja and offerings to deities. But the provincial leader did not want to get the Sri Lankan black magic people to perform this task as they were not faithful to him and decided to get the help from black magic people in a place called SALA in India. So, he sent people to contact them. But they refused the invitation.

The provincial leader was so keen to get them, that he performed a trick. He knew that the people who refused to come were fond of gambling. So, to motivate them he arranged gambling, and the information was sent to them. This time they accepted the offer and arrived in Sri Lanka.

The place where people from SALA arrived was identified as "Sala Ava". Over time, it evolved to be HALAWATHA.

Veteran Author Jayakody Seneviratne Passes Away

Veteran author Jayakody Seneviratne, who left an indelible mark in the annals of Sri Lankan literature, has passed away at the age of 86.

He started his writing career as a short story writer and made a great contribution to the literary field of Sri Lanka by authoring 68 novels and compiling many other works.

His first novel "Adara Ganga Galana Desa" was published in 1968.

'Siththarekuta Pem Benda', 'Demassino', 'Mihindum Salu', 'Rana Thisaru', 'Pini Palasa', 'Swarana Varna' and 'Urachakramalaya' are some of his works.

His book 'Kumari Hami' won the State Literary Award in 1984 and this novel was also the basis for the teledrama by the same name. His novels Nomarena Minissu, Kasthirasa, Nikini Wessa, Dahasgawdura (Sahodarayek) were made into teledramas.

He was born on March 20, 1936 and received his education at the Government School, Kalutara, Bombuwala Buddhist Mixed School and then Tissa Central College, Kalutara after passing his grade 5 scholarship examination.




