The Australian Citizenship Council noted that an annual citizenship day would increase community awareness of Australian citizenship while providing a focal point for citizenship-related activities and celebrations.

The first Australian Citizenship Day was celebrated in 2001, coinciding with the Centenary of Federation.

In response to an enquiry by Daehaena, the Sri Lankan High Commission in Canberra communicates as follows:



The documentations in connection with passports, affidavits, life certificates (for pensioners), power of attorney, bank documents or any other consular related matters can be attested by a Justice of Peace (JP) or General Practitioner (GP) in Queensland and the said documents could be for-

warded to this Mission by post for further action which is the standard practice.

In this regard, there are no charges for the services rendered by a IP.

Kindly note that these are the procedures followed by other states/accredited countries where there is no Sri Lankan Honorary Consul or resident Diplomatic Mission.

This Mission process all the Consular/Passport applications prior to sending them to the relevant Sri Lankan authorities. The Mission charges administrative/processing fees for Consular functions (Certification, Attestation etc.) from the applicants as per the government regulations. Book Review: Nomakena Sevaneli (නොමැකෙන සෙවණැලි" by Hemamala Herath

This is an unusual book review/ extract in that it is written in English about a Sinhala book.



"Nomakena Sevaneli" is based on a true story woven around the diary of a person named Julia, the author Hemamala Herath had met during her 13 year long stay in Wodonga, Victoria.

Both Julia and Hemamala had been members of an Inter-faith Group that was involved in social work and charities in Wodonga. During meetings it was discovered that Julia had faced serious difficulties in life, and that she had written about them in a diary and notes.

Julia, the elder daughter of a bricklayer father and a mother who was a nurse living in a yet to be completed home had psychological issues seeing and

communicating with unreal beings. While she was the favourite of her father, she had a difficult relationship with her mother and her beautiful, smart sister. Julia falls in love and marries the son of her neighbour Tom. Over time, while her marriage to Tom sours and they go their separate ways, her sister marries well and on her way to success and happy life. But life is full of surprises.

Running parallel to the story of Julia is the story of Aathma, who lives in Wodonga with her husband and is a writer whose books are published in Sri Lanka. Life of her parents who moved to Melbourne after their working life in Sri Lanka revolves around the younger siblings of Aathma and the Sri Lankan community. The values of Aathma and those of her siblings are quite different and

this causes friction in the family although they pale in comparison to those of Julia.

Riding the ripples in life, the issues get resolved and Aathma looks back at life as unfading images.

This is a book about humanity. Despite the differences in culture and backgrounds, a common thread of family relationships remains intact.



Stories Behind Names of Places in Sri Lanka RAMBEWA

Rambewa is a village in the North Central province of Sri Lanka. Very often, most names of places in the North Central province are linked to the Kings of the Anuradhapura era. It is a historic Kingdom that went under the rule of Indian King Elara and recaptured by the famous King Dutu Gemunu. A fierce battle was fought and it ended with a dual fight between the two leaders.

Thereafter King Dutu Gemunu restored law and order in the country and developed agriculture appointing his own brother as the person in-charge of agriculture development. Along with that he gave his best attention to the establishment of Buddhism in the country.

The largest stupa in the world, "Ruwanveliseya" is one such work of King Dutu Gemunu. Every detail of how he constructed the pagoda is explained in the Mahawansa, the biggest historical record of ancient Sri Lanka. There was no forced labour used in the construction of it and all those who sweated for the construction were paid by the King.



It is said that the King transported gold from some parts of the country loaded on the backs of cattle to Anuradhapura to meet the expenses of building the Ruwanveli stupa and other needs.

This method of transport was the

most popular form of transporting crop and precious things at that time. This transport system was called "Thavalama".

The cattle had to be rested, fed and supplied with water to drink and bathe in these long journeys. So, these gold transporting oxen were rested overnight under strict security unloading the bags of gold before they took the final lap to Anuradhapura. The Sinhala word for unloading is "BANAWA". "BEWA" is "unloaded. The Sinhala word for GOLD is "RAN". The place where Gold was unloaded was "Ran bewa thena". Over time, "Ran Bewa" became one word "Rambewa" (OPED).

Sri Lankan Coffee and Tea as a Symbol of Multiculturalism

The Passing of Merrill J Fernando was a significant event in the history of Ceylon Tea. The Dilmah foundation was instrumental in documenting Sri Lankan history, ecology, ethnic diversity and other topics, which have been invaluable to our research over the years.



Tea originates in China, to which historical Ceylon has been intimately connected, but most countries surrounding Sri Lanka refer to tea as chai.

This is because the character symbolising tea can be pronounced "te" or "cha" depending on the language in question. Thus, the

Lankan pronunciation of te reflects the historical part of China that Lankan tea was originally sourced from. Travelling Chinese tradesmen were also a conduit through which Ceylon tea was popularised.

The people of Scotland had a significant influence on Sri Lanka's tea industry. It was Scotsman James Taylor who pioneered the industry in Ceylon. During the 18th century many Scottish people were forcefully evicted from their homes in Scotland, in what is known as "The clearances". Many such individuals made their way to places like Ceylon, where they worked on tea estates.

It is noteworthy that many place names in tea growing regions are of Scottish origin such as Dalhousie, Elgin Falls, Blair Athol, Glen Eagles and many more. Many Scotsmen chose to permanently settle in Ceylon including James Taylor himself. Through these communities, Sri Lanka is connected to Scotland and the ancient Celtic peoples and language which are etched into the Lankan landscape.

Britain invested heavily in tea by building estates and railways, near which many Sri Lankan towns sprung up. It was predominantly the Ceylonese Afghan community that provided the labour that built these famous railways and cared for animals on estates. British tea culture is also ubiquitous in Sri Lanka, with milky tea and biscuits as well as afternoon tea being iconic in Lankan practices.

Less humane was the transportation of migrant Tamil labourers to Sri Lanka. Compelled to Ceylon to escape hellish conditions in Southern India under British rule, these resilient and hardworking communities endured disease, death, physical and sexual violence to seek prosperity in the tea industry. This community and their exceptionally skilled pickers form the backbone of the Lankan tea industry. Their treatment and continued impoverishment following Sri Lankan independence are an indictment of the society that surrounds them.

The tea industry also brought together Moorish and Chetty traders and Sinhalese investors and landowners, whose contributions are too numerous to outline in this short article.

The descendants of the aforementioned communities represent another lingering remnant of the multicultural history of Ceylon Tea, as descendants of Scottish, British, Tamil, Moorish, Afghan, and Chinese communities continue to live in Sri Lanka. Their contributions through living and working in Sri Lanka form an ongoing influence of the multicultural endeavour that is Ceylon Tea.

Fittingly, the surname 'Fernando', now associated with tea and cultural preservation, is of Portuguese origin. It refers to the concept of a bold journeyman.

Tea, like everything else in Sri Lanka, was the result of multicultural cooperation across the world.

The Voice to Parliament

The 2023 Australian Indigenous Voice referendum will ask voters to approve an alteration to the Australian Constitution, creating a body called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice that "may make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Govern-



ment ... on matters relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples". The referendum, conducted by the Australian Electoral Commission, will be held on Saturday the 14 October 2023.

For the change to the Constitution to be validated, the referendum needs to gather a majority of votes in favour at the national level as well as in at least four of the six States (a double majority).

Proposed Question

A Proposed Law: To alter the Constitution to recognise the First Peoples of Australia by establishing an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice. Do you approve this proposed alteration?

Proposed Amendment

In recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the First Peoples of Australia:

- 1. There shall be a body, to be called the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice;
- The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice may make representations to the Parliament and the Executive Government of the Commonwealth on matters relating to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;
- The Parliament shall, subject to this Constitution, have power to make laws with respect to matters relating to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice, including its composition, functions, powers and procedures.

Arguments For

Reconciliation and Empowerment: Supporters assert that a Voice to Parliament would symbolise a significant step towards reconciliation by acknowledging the historical marginalization of Indigenous communities.

Cultural and Traditional Knowledge: An Indigenous advisory body could enrich policymaking with unique cultural and traditional perspectives.

Consultation and Partnership: A formal Voice could establish a structured mechanism for ongoing consultation between the government and Indigenous groups.

Arguments Against

Equality and Representation: Critics argue that granting a specific group a separate advisory body could undermine the principle of equal representation.

Divisiveness and Identity Politics: The establishment of a Voice might inadvertently encourage identity politics and divisions within society.

Practical Implementation: Critics raise concerns about the practicality of implementing a Voice to Parliament. Questions about the exact structure, functions, and powers of such a body could complicate the process and potentially lead to bureaucratic inefficiencies.


