


OUR PRESIDENT SPEAKS


I extend my sincere appreciation to Delon Udugamasooriya and the committee for their unwavering dedication to ensuring the success of the cricket tournament.

The committee is buzzing with excitement, and you'll be too when you join us on April 27th at Cathie's Lane. Stay tuned for more updates and exciting teasers!


PETERITE POWERLIFTER

rne second photo captures the area near Fr. Rector's office where Ajith used to park his 125cc motorcycle for safekeeping.






YVES KELAART TURNS 98


He used to ride his 125 cc bike to college and park it near Fr Rector's office.

Rodney was our 5th President and served during the years 1992/93 to 1993/94 and 1999/00 to 2001/02.



VALENTINO PEREIRA - 8th December


Valentino was our OBSC Melbourne President in 2019/20 and 2020/21 and has been a Committee member since 2014.


DILHAN PERERA (Captain)


