Honouring Josephian sports achievers

HE Annual Colours Day of St. Joseph's College, 2019 to 2022 Courage, Quadrennial Sports Awards Ceremony to honour Josephians who excelled in sports, was held recently at the Rev. Fr. Dr. Stanley Abeysekara Sports Complex.

The distinguished old Josephian, veteran world class player and Sri Lankan cricketer, **Chaminda Vaas**, graced the occasion as the chief guest. Vaas was a member of the Sri Lankan team that won the Cricket World Cup in 1996 and he is the only bowler to take an eightwicket-haul in one day internationals.

At present, he is bowling coach for various teams, including the Sri Lankan national team. He has contributed significantly to developing young bowlers and franchise cricket.

In his speech, Vaas conveyed a message to the young Josephians: "In order to move forward and reach the pinnacle of success in sports, you need to be courageous and work laboriously, with dedication and determination." His message for the parents of the young Josephians was to encourage their children to participate in sports and not force them to participate and not to interfere with their sports activities in order to evolve independently.

Vaas, fondly recalled his golden memories of playing for St. Joseph's College, Colombo, and with his elephantine memory he could remember all the school matches he played in and in particular the first match played in the 1990s.

In his speech, Rev. Fr. Ranjith Andradi, Rector and Principal of St. Joseph's College, appreciated and admired the illustrious career and remarkable achievements made by Chaminda Vaas on the cricket field that have brought immense pride to St. Joseph's College and have made an indelible mark on the history of Sri Lankan cricket. His dedication, skills and sportsmanship have earned him a well-deserved place among the cricketing greats and his record-breaking performances

and ability to inspire his teammates have played a pivotal role for many Sri Lankan triumphs on the international cricket stage.

Furthermore, Fr. Andradi appreciated Chaminda Vaas's contributions that extend beyond the cricket field. As a mentor, coach and ambassador for the sport, he has continued to inspire and guide the next generation of cricketers. His commitment to nurturing young talent and giving back to the community reflects his deep passion for the game and his unwavering belief in its "power to transform lives."

"St. Joseph's College has been the undisputed champions in swimming, cricket, basketball, soccer and badminton and has done exceptionally well in athletics, rugby, hockey, tennis and other sports. The Josephian award winners have brought glory and honour to their Alma Mater with their outstanding achievements from 2019 to 2022.

An astounding record of over 500 Josephians included 228 Josephian coloursmen and 48 Josephians who represented Sri Lanka in various sports and 23 Josephians who have won the most prestigious and highest award for a Josephian achiever, "JOSEPHIAN BLUE" and 269 Merit award winners were honoured on that day.

Sportsmen of the Year were Dishane Ranaweera (swimming) 2019, Shenal Sandesh (football), Shehan Fernando (basketball) 2021 and Dunith Wellalage (cricket), 2022.

High jumper Ethirveerasingham dies in Los Angeles

Dr. Nagalingam Ethirveerasingham, one of the greatest sportsmen born in Sri Lanka and who won Sri Lanka's first gold medal in the Asian Games, passed away in the United States of America last April. Dr. Ethirveerasingham, who was 90 years old, held the Sri Lankan high jump record for nearly four decades since 1953.

He won the gold medal at the Third Asian Games in Tokyo, Japan, in 1958 by setting a new Asian Games record of 2.03 metres and won the silver medal in the same event in 1962.


Dr. Ethirveerasingham also represented Sri Lanka in the 1952 Helsinki and 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games.

He was an alumnus of Jaffna Central College and St. Joseph's College, Colombo.

Later, he made a great contribution to the development of athletics in Sri Lanka and launched a number of programs for the development of athletics, especially in the Northern and Eastern Provinces. and was constantly associated with the Sri Lanka Athletics Institute until his death.

When American Olympic decathlon champion Bob Mathias visited St Joseph's College, Colombo, in 1955 he observed Ethir doing the high jump in his usual crouch position. Mathias suggested he try the western roll. Ethir obliged and cleared the bar.
