# The President's Message

In November 2023 when elected as the President of the Sri Lanka Association (SLA), I stated in my inaugural address that I wish to reinvigorate our Association's founding principles and return to our roots.

The Association was founded in 1972 as a home for all those of Sri Lankan origin living in New South Wales. It was open to all, irrespective of ethnic origin or religious beliefs and affiliations. It was not limited to Sinhalese, Tamil, Muslim, Burgher, Malay communities or those following Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam, or Christianity.

In pursuing this vision, the Association under my leadership reached out to all communities and religious groups.

For the first time in the history of our Association, we participated in an Iftar event during Ramadan organised by the Austra Lanka Muslim Association (ALMA) attended by over 400 Sri Lankan Muslims living in Sydney. We also participated in the Vesak Bakthi Geeta program of the Lankarama Buddhist Vihara and the Sinhala & Tamil New Year celebrations organised by the Sinhalese Cultural Forum (SCF). We collaborated with the Tamil community and the Sri Lanka Catholic Association and the Sri Lanka Malay Association by supporting and participating in their events.

Sri Lanka Association is a voluntary not-for-profit organisation devoted to community work for all Australians in New South Wales and contributes to charities in Sri Lanka and Australia.

Its program of community and charitable work includes:

- organising Blood Donation campaigns
- feeding the Homeless by providing cooked meals,
- raising funds to purchase lifesaving medical equipment for paediatric hospitals in Sri Lanka,
- economic upliftment of poor families in Sri Lanka,
- scholarships for poor rural children in secondary schools in Sri Lanka
- recognising and felicitating HSC High Achievers with an ATAR of 95 plus of Sri Lankan origin
- organising Seniors Day lunches and musical programs for Senior citizens

I am happy to state that we have built a firm foundation for the Association to continue its important journey in the coming years. I thank the members of my committee for their support during the year and the membership of the Association for supporting and participating in events organised by the SLA.

# Sri Lanka Independence Day Celebrations

The 76<sup>th</sup> Independence Day of Sri Lanka was celebrated by the Sri Lanka Association of NSW Inc (SLA) and the Sinhalese Cultural Forum (SCF) with the active participation of Sinhalese, Tamil, Muslim, Malay, and Burgher communities on

4<sup>th</sup> February 2024 at the Roselea Community Centre, Carlingford.

In the absence of a Sri Lanka Consulate in Sydney, the Sri Lanka Association and the Sinhalese Cultural Forum steered the celebration of Sri Lanka's National Day in an elegant and grand event graced by a large gathering of Sri Lankans from all ethnicities and well-wishers and dignitaries from the wider Australian community.

A highlight of the event was the blessings from the invited religious dignitaries from the four major religions Buddhism, Hinduism, Christianity, and Islam practiced in Sri Lanka for a prosperous and united Sri Lanka.

The Independence Day Messages from President Ranil Wickremasinghe, Prime Minister Dinesh Gunawardene, and Foreign Minister Hon Ali Sabry were read out in Sinhalese, Tamil, and English languages.

Among the highlights was the hoisting of the Sri Lankan flag inside the hall by the President of SLA Kalinga Wijeyewardene and the President of SCF Champa Buddhipala amidst the beating of Magul Bera, the children's choir singing the national anthems of Sri Lanka and Australia, and lighting of the traditional lamp by dignitaries.

In his address to the gathering President of SLA, Kalinga Wijeyewardene said that the SLA was formed in 1972 with the

sacred goal of unifying all Sri Lankans of all communities and religious faiths represented in New South Wales. It is the only organisation representing all residents of Sri Lankan origin in NSW. During its fifty years of service to the Sri Lankan community SLA has helped our community in NSW and our brothers and sisters in Sri Lanka during periods of adversity. SLA together with SCF spearheaded the fundraising for Tsunami relief. More recently, during the economic crisis, SLA lobbied the Federal Government to assist Sri Lanka, and as a result, it provided \$50 million of assistance to SL through UN Agencies. SLA also raised funds and donated medical equipment and medicines to the Paediatric Unit of the Cancer Hospital in Sri Lanka during the crisis.

### **Lankarama Temple Wesak Programme**


The Sri Lanka Association and its members participated in the celebrations and religious observances this year at the Lankarama Buddhist Temple, Schofields.

The Wesak festival commemorates the Birth, Enlightenment (Nibbāna), and Death (Parinirvāna) of Gautama Buddha. It is a holy day in the Buddhist calendar and falls on the Full Moon day in May.

In particular, the SLA participated in the Wesa Bakthi Geetha (Devotional Songs) program. The SLA choir consisting of twelve committee members sang the song "Mal Sugande Dham Sugande" before a large gathering of devotees. The performance was well received and the skills of the choir were commended by the audience.

Wesak is celebrated grandly at the Lankarama Temple every year. As in previous years, many thousands of devotees gathered at the temple on this year's Wesak Day. The Temple was decorated with colourful lanterns and mini Pandals.

In Sri Lanka, the Vesak is celebrated by the Buddhist community with religious observances in temples, providing free food to people at roadside stalls (dansalas), and decorations with colourful lanterns and multi-coloured illuminations in homes and commercial premises. People gather to watch and listen to the narration of Pandals (illuminated giant paintings on the roadside) with several panels depicting stories from the life of the Buddha and stories from his past lives (Jataka stories).

# "Sunfest", Sinhala & Tamil New Year Celebrations

The Sri Lankan traditional New Year, generally known as "Aluth Avurudda" in Sri Lanka, is a Sri Lankan holiday that celebrates the traditional New Year of the Sinhalese and Tamil population of Sri Lanka. It is a major anniversary celebrated by the Sinhalese and Tamil people and most Sri Lankans.



Sinhala and Tamil New Year is celebrated in Sri Lanka by the island's two main ethnic groups in April. Originally a harvest

festival, this event marks the passage of the Sun from the constellation Pisces to Aries. The special holiday is celebrated in Sri Lanka with the observance of traditional rituals, merrymaking, feasting, and community games and festivals.

He said that it is essential for the younger generation of Sri Lankans born in Australia to experience the roots by participating in the traditional customs, foods, games, and performances associated with the New Year festivities so that they appreciate and value our traditional culture.

He commended the parents for bringing their children to this event so that they would live and feel the cultural heritage that is theirs. He further said that it is important as the future leaders of our community, the children are entrusted to carry forward these traditions in the years to come.

The President of the SCF, Mr Champa Buddhipala, expressed similar sentiments in his speech and thanked all participating community organisatons.

# Collaboration between Sri Lanka Association and Austra - Lanka Muslim Association during Ramadan

As part of President Kalinga Wijeyewardene's initiative to build bridges between the various Sri Lankan Communities in NSW, the SLA participated in an Iftar Event during the Holy Month of Ramadan organised by the Austra – Lanka Musim Association (ALMA).

Iftar is the meal eaten after sunset following the breaking of the fast-following Maghrib prayers. Iftar or the breaking of the fast, is one of the most significant points in the day during Ramadan, the ninth month in the Islamic calendar.

The Iftar event at the Granville Community Centre in Sydney was attended by over 300 Sri Lankan Muslim community members. The SLA Committee and their spouses participated in the event and were warmly welcomed by Mohamed Rizme Cassim President of ALMA and the committee members of ALMA.



### Religious observances on Ramadan

Both SLA President and ALMA President observed that this was an excellent opportunity to foster collaboration and mutual support between our organizations for the betterment of the Sri Lankan community in NSW and to understand and appreciate the culture and religious observances of the Sri Lanka Musim community.

SLA President thanked SLA Vice President Jabeer Cader for taking the lead in organising the event on the decision taken by the SLA Committee to collaborate with ALMA.

This was a historic occasion as it was the first time that the SLA had participated in a significant religious observance of the Sri Lanka Muslim Community.
